She will also highlight the Career Mark Primary award as a tool for quality assuring a career programme and showcasing good practice to the community.

Currently the Operational Hub Lead for the Greater Lincolnshire LEP's Careers Hub. Alex has been working in the careers space for the last 6 years and is currently leading on the Greater Lincolnshire Careers Hub Start Small; Dream Big Programme.
